With the opening tomorrow (Feb. 1, 2012) of the Whistler Blackcomb Foundation Social Services Centre [1], Sea to Sky Community Services (SSCS) is expanding the support it is able to provide to Whistlerites.

In its new location, SSCS will provide:

- Counselling services for women surviving abuse
- Counselling services for children who have experienced issues regarding sexual abuse
- An infant development program providing services to families with children up to three years of age
- Physiotherapy consultation services for children up to five years of age
- An employment program (starting in April)
- Family and children services

“We’re pleased to have been able to work with other agencies in the area to create this fabulous new site. The fact many services are under one roof should make it easier for community members to get the help they need. We encourage people to drop in, call us or visit our website to see how we can support them – whether in a crisis or just with everyday challenges,” says Lois Wynne, the society’s executive director.
