This unique opportunity serves Indigenous peoples within the jurisdiction of the St'atl'imx Tribal Police, supporting Southern St'atl'imx communities: Lil'wat Nation (Mount Currie), N'Quatqua (D'arcy), Samahquam (Baptiste Smith), Skatin (Skookumchuck) and Xax'sta (Douglas).

## Applicants should have:

- Diploma in a related human/social service field.
- Two (2) years recent related experience.
- Or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience.
- Valid BC Class 5 driver's license.
- Valid emergency first aid certificate

## We're looking for candidates who have:

- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Experience and familiarity with the justice system and social services including the Crime Victim Assistance Program.
- Knowledge of dynamics of violence in intimate relationships, sexual assault, criminal harassment and sexual/physical abuse in childhood.
- Knowledge of crisis intervention and support skills.
- Ability to work cooperatively and effectively with justice system personnel and other victim service and community programs.
- Ability to work independently and on a team.
- Knowledge and understanding of Indigenous cultural customs, protocols and traditions.
- Basic computer skills.
