



## Victim Services Worker - Pemberton

Part-time, 17.5 hrs/week

This role requires travel to Lil'wat Nation and surrounding communities, as well as court attendance in Pemberton.

The Victim Services Worker provides support services to clients who have been victims of crime. They assess and address clients' safety needs, assist and support victims with the justice system, provides emotional support and validation, and assess clients' need for other services. They provide referral information about Ministry of Justice supports and information regarding housing services, financial benefits, community and social service agencies and counselling, health, and mental health services.

### Qualifications:

1. Diploma in a related human/social service field.
2. Two (2) years recent related experience.
3. Or an equivalent combination of education, training and experience.
4. Valid BC Class 5 driver's license.
5. Valid emergency first aid certificate.

### Job skills and abilities:

1. Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
2. Experience and familiarity with the justice system and social services including the Crime Victim Assistance Program.
3. Knowledge of dynamics of violence in intimate relationships, sexual assault, criminal harassment, and sexual/physical abuse in childhood.
4. Knowledge of crisis intervention and support skills.
5. Ability to work cooperatively and effectively with justice system personnel and other victim service and community programs.
6. Ability to work independently and on a team.
7. Knowledge and understanding of Indigenous cultural customs, protocols, and traditions.
8. Basic computer skills.

3. Proof of full Covid-19 vaccination.
